

This is by far the toughest review I have written because I don't know if it's possible for me to articulate how good The Theater Of War really is. I never buy audio books, but when I saw this was narrated by Adam Driver I had to have it. Adam Driver and his wife Joanne Tucker started AITAF (Arts In The Armed Forces) a non profit that brings theater to our men and women in uniform. I have my own background in military support and it also involved getting entertainment to the troops, so the work being done by Bryan Doerries, Adam Driver and Joanne Tucker is near and dear to my heart. Something very special happens when people who have passion for something greater than themselves come together and create. That is what happened here. The combination of Doerries words and the emotional delivery by Driver is indescribably good. It is moving, unfiltered and raw, something that I believe can deeply affect military members and their loved ones. The plays and individual stories that are discussed in The Theater Of War are immeasurably useful for starting dialogues for veterans. They are thought provoking and provide a starting point for individuals who may struggle to speak their truth after the trauma of war. You needn't be in the military to reap the benefits of this work by Doerries. The stories of tragedy, struggle and survival are universal and can be applied to many situations and occupations. I really can't recommend this highly enough. I will be buying the book as soon as it's available in paperback as a back up reference. I suggest buying the audio version first, it's read with conviction by someone who cares about the subject matter and for that reason alone it's soul stirring. This is an important piece of work that needs to be shared. Buy it, listen to it, read it, share it - You will not come away from it, without learning something about yourself.
