

What a thrilling journey! This bookâ [™]s 338 pages of main text contain 100 tales from history, separated into 33 parts â " each of which contains about three tales with a specific theme. Most of these stories take place from the eighteenth to the twentieth centuries, and each recounts a little-known event in history from various locations in the world.I was familiar with just a few of these events - having read about them in other books such as this one - but they all had me glued to my seat. The authorâ [™]s writing style is clear, friendly, lively, to-the-point and immensely captivating. In reading this book, I never experienced a dull moment; needless to say, I found it very difficult to put down.I do believe that absolutely anyone can enjoy this amazing book, not only history enthusiasts but also readers fascinated by peculiar and absorbing historical facts that havenâ [™]t made it into most standard history books.
