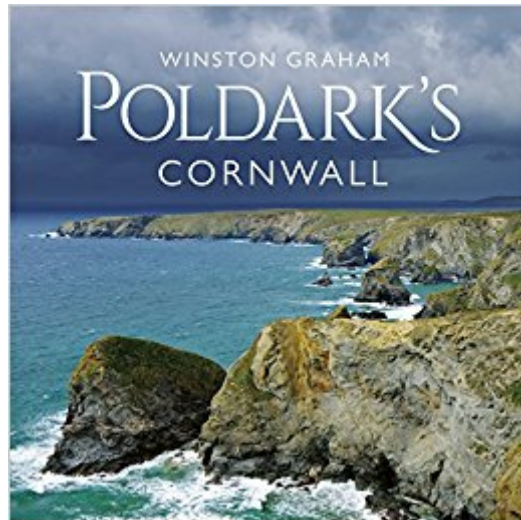

This is a beautiful coffee-table book that has marvelous views of places in Cornwall that inspired Winston Graham as he wrote the Poldark series and other books. I was expecting more of a historical book that would have told more about how things were like in Cornwall in the late 18th century, but this book talks more about Graham's experiences with his family in Cornwall and some about the making of the first BBC Poldark Television series. I did like the book very much, especially the illustrations--but I was a little disappointed in the quality of the printing. You can feel the ink on the paper, which makes it seem kind of cheap.

Winston Graham was really thinking when he wrote this exquisite companion to his Poldark series of books. Although never having visited (it's on my bucket list!) I feel the magic of this special place with descriptive text and photography that captures the heart with its wildness and beauty.

Graham's personal account of his experiences in Cornwall are wonderful insight into the writing of his novels. A must read for anyone interested in English culture and /or the Graham series of captivating books.
